- Lucilla Phelps FRPS, freelanced for 10 years before joining Sotheby's full time, firstly as Principal
 Photographer and ending up as Head of Photography. Since retiring she has taught photography to
 adults in Richmond, lectured to scores of societies in the SE and now SW of England, judged
 international exhibitions and had images accepted for many international and national exhibitions.
 She was chair for 10 years of the Professional Panel of the Royal Photographic Society assessing
 distinction submissions for ARPS and FRPS.
